Successful completion of the courses listed below, a successful admission score for the Educator Preparation Program (EPP), and the GPA requirements (**2.75 overall; 3.0 in content area & professional education coursework**) will entitle a person to receive the degree Bachelor of Science in Education (BSEd) with a major in Middle School Education and the area of emphasis. This degree may lead to a Missouri certificate to teach grades 5 – 9 in the State of Missouri.

When scheduling General Education Courses that are marked as an elective, please check the required courses from your specific content area to see if they fit a category. If these courses are used in the Gen Ed, students may need to add electives in either education or content area to meet the 120-credit hour minimum.
