One of the main objectives of Learning in Retirement is lifelong learning. The LIR scholarship supports this objective with particular emphasis on Lincoln University students. The LIR scholarship, in the amount of \$2500.00 will be awarded annually to a Lincoln University undergraduate student of any major.

Eligibility Criteria:

- Missouri High School Graduate or MO HS Equivalency Certificate
- Current Status as of December 31, 2021: Sophomore (30-59 sem. credit hrs.) or Junior (60-89 sem. credit hrs.)
- GPA of 3.0 or higher.
- Financial need

Applicants should submit the scholarship application, a resume with evidence of community/campus involvement, an **unofficial** transcript, and a one-page essay addressing educational goals and how the scholarship will assist with achieving those goals.

The award will be applied to the upcoming fall semester and will be sent directly to Lincoln University student accounts and applied to the recipient's account. The recipient is strongly encouraged to attend the LIR summer meeting held on July 20, 2022.
